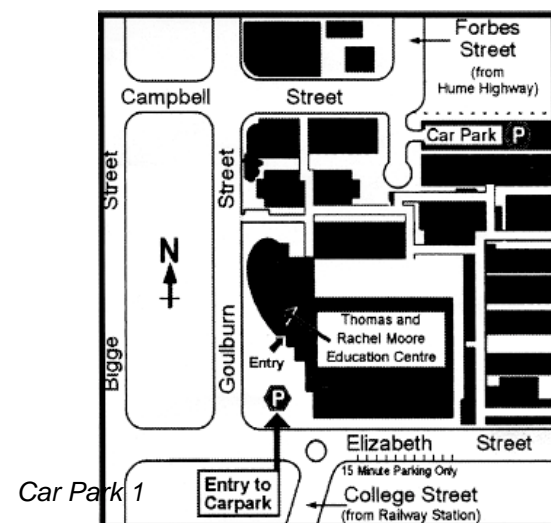

CLOSING DATE: 30th April, 2001

Acceptance of abstracts will be notified by the 15th of May, 2001.

Abstracts must contain the aims of the study, methods, results and discussion. Abstracts not meeting these criteria will be rejected.

Abstract Guidelines:

- Abstracts must be typed in English
- Use Arial Font, 12 point, with single line spacing.
- Abstracts must not exceed 400 words (preferably between 300-400 words), excluding title, authors and institution.
- The Title should be in capitals followed by the author's name - do not include titles or degrees.
- 3 references should be used.
- Use abbreviations only for common terms.
